### Important Traffic Information for Race Day

The Brighton Marathon hopes to be a fantastic event for runners, residents, local commerce and retailers. After a very successful first year we have made two small changes to the route. Over the next two pages are some key points to help you plan your Sunday without disappointment.

Start Time: 9am in Preston Park.

Runners and spectators will start arriving from 7am

Preston Park: The Park will be used from Saturday April 14th until Sunday April 15h. Access to the park will be compromised from 6am until 10am on the Sunday -Race Day

Finish Time: 4pm on Madeira Drive, dependent on the last runner to finish. All roads around the city (apart from Madeira Drive) will be re-opened by 4pm. If runners are still on the course we will kindly ask them to move on to the pavement where necessary.

Madeira Drive: This is the location of the Finish area including marquees and the Finish line. This will be constructed from Saturday April 14th and in place until Sunday April 15th. There will be a partial closure of Madeira Drive during this period.

Changes to the course: The Marathon route turns from St James Street onto Lower Rock Gardens instead of going all the way through Kemp Town to Eaton Road. This allows access to Upper St James Street and St George's Road all day.

The Route now includes a section of Boundary Road from New Church Road, south to Seaford Road.

### Roads affected into Brighton from 7am until 11.30am

- Preston Circus closed from 7am until 10.15am
- London Road into Brighton / Hove will be diverted west at
- South Road and can travel into Brighton via Dyke Road.
- London Road into Brighton / East Brighton will be diverted east at Harrington Road until 10.15am
- A270 from Falmer travelling into Brighton / Hove will be diverted west onto Hollingdean Road
- A270 from Falmer travelling into East Brighton / Rottingdean will be diverted east onto Elm Grove until 11.30am
- Travelling from Hove to East Brighton you will need to use
- Old Shoreham Road and follow diversions. Preston Circus will be open for west to east access from 10.15am
- Ditchling Road travelling to Brighton / Hove will be diverted at Fiveways to Preston Drove
- Ditchling Road travelling to East Brighton / Rottingdean will be diverted at Fiveways to Bear Road
- Bear Road will have access to Hollingdean Road via the
- Vogue Gyratory all day
- Elm Grove to Brighton / Hove will be diverted to Hollingdean Road until 11.30am
- Southover Street will have no access onto Lewes Road until 11.30am
- Edwards Street will have no access onto Pavilion Parade until 11.30am

### Roads affected into Brighton from 7.30am until 1.30pm

- A259 from Eastbourne will be diverted north at Rottingdean from 7.30am till 1.30pm
- Traffic from Ovingdean to Brighton will need to travel through
- Woodingdean via Falmer Road Ovingdean to Rottingdean / Eastbourne will need to travelvia

### Falmer Road Roads affected until 3pm

- The Drive will have limited access onto Grand Avenuefrom
- 9am to 3pm Part of Boundary Road will be closed from 9am to 3pm.

### Roads affected into Brighton until 4pm

- Access onto the Old Steine will not be available from 7am
- West Street will have access to the car parks all day but have
- A259 from Shoreham will have access as far as Third Avenue until 4pm

### **Uninterrupted Access**

- Hove Street will have uninterrupted access onto Kingsway as far east as Third Avenue
- Access from Portland Road to the A259 will be via Church
- Road and not from Boundary Road
- Residents living south of Church Road / New Church Road
- and west of Grand Avenue will have access all day on to Kingsway but will have no access onto Church Road Residents living north of Church Road / New Church Road
- and west of Grand Avenue will have access all day on to Blatchington Road / Portland Road but will have no access onto Church Road / New Church Road

### Other key areas of Brighton & Hove and how they are affected

Buses: Brighton and Hove Buses will be revising their timetable to work with the marathon and its runners.

St James Street: This is a major part of the marathon route and we hope that traders and residents alike embrace the atmosphere of thousands of runners using it as an essential and exciting part of the course. However traffic management of the area will commence from 6am with the road closed between 7.30am and until 11.30am on the day

Brighton Marina: Access to Brighton Marina can be made via Wilson Avenue at all times throughout the day. Access to the Marina from Rottingdean will be available from 1.30pm.

# Other key areas of Brighton & Hove and how they are affected Continued...

**Tesco Hove:** Tesco's is open as normal. There is no access to the Car Park via Church Road. Access to and egress from the Car Park is via a purpose build entrance / exit which can be found on Haddington Road. Haddington Road is a turning off Blatchington Road, which runs parallel to Church Road. Please see advert on page 5 Churchill Square Car Parks: Access to Churchill Square can be made via the Hove exit from the A27 and then down Dyke Road and head towards Brighton Station and Queen's Road. Both Churchill Square and the carparks are open as normal and additional staff will manually assist the access and egress.

King Alfred Leisure Centre: This will only be open to pedestrians on race day as the car park will not be accessible. Thank you to the staff who have been very supportive of our activity on the day. Carats Cafe Bar: Accessible by foot and an excellent viewing point to see the runners go by with a bacon buttie or mug of tea from Carats! Thanks to owner Chris Kraszewski again for his support.

### **Train Stations**

### **Brighton and Hove Stations:**

These will operate as normal but will be very busy due to the expected amount of visitors and runners.

## The following stations will be busier than usual but services are not affected:

- Portslade Station
- London Road Station
- Preston Park Station
- Falmer Station

### Parking Bay Suspensions

For runner and crowd safety there will be parking bay suspensions in order. Times and locations will be advertised and signage in place seven days before coming active.

- Grand Avenue | Church Road
- New Church Road | Boundary Road

### Disabled/wheelchair Spectator Access

Various areas of the Marathon course are wheelchair friendly and so we hope that this caters for anyone with a disability. In particular we would direct wheelchair users to Hove Lawns area which is flat and accessible, Hove Esplanade, Grand Avenue and certain areas of New Church Road. We anticipate that New Road, Jubilee Street and St James Street will be very busy and not recommended for wheelchair users unless they are happy to mingle through heavy crowds.
